Scholarships Available For Young Drivers

The Good Samaritan Medical Center Foundation received a grant from Farmers Insurance Company to support the Denver Metro Teen Drivers program.

The Scholarships will be awarded up to \$600 to pay the cost of driver's training that includes 30 hours of in-person learning and 6 hours of on the road experience with a trainer. Teens throughout the community are invited to apply, including the children of GSMC caregivers.



Preferred Application Deadline: July 22

The grant will be used to award scholarships to teens who wish to complete a driver's training course prior to testing for their driver's permit. To qualify, students must submit an essay about distracted driving and their views on steps that can be taken to prevent injuries from automobile crashes due to distracted driving.
